




Welcome

Today's Bible story is about a wicked Pharaoh, who once ruled Egypt. He used the Hebrew people a slaves and treated them cruelly.

But God continued to increase the number of Hebrews, soon the Pharaoh became worried that there would be more of them than his own people. To everyone's horror he decided to order his soldiers to kill all the baby boys.

The Hebrews were terrified they tried to hide their babies in any way they could. Some mothers hid them in a baskets.



We call this basket a Moses basket.
