Drinks



- > Please supply your child with a small plastic bottle, with their name on,
 - As the children are free to drink throughout the day please only put water in the bottles (no squash).
- Water bottles are stored on the table in the orchard, to avoid spillages in the classroom and allow for easy collection at the end of the day.





- All children are entitled to a school dinner through the universal free school meals for primary school pupils (Reception, Year I and Year2).
- School dinners need to be ordered via the payments option in ParentMail.
- School dinners are served in the hall in the main building If you chose to provide your own packed lunch please keep it healthy, chocolate bars, fizzy drinks, cans, glass bottles or hot soup are not allowed.
- ➤ If you are eligible for free school meals (details in the welcome pack) please still register as this will raise extra funds for the school.







For School


I am emotionally ready
