### KS1

The Golden Rule in Christianity is based on Matthew 7v12: So, in everything, do to others what you would have them do to you

Jesus is an important figure for most Christians and is believed to be the '**Son of God**'.

Jesus was Jewish and the first Christians were Jewish.

Many Christians believe Jesus died on the cross but then he rose again and this leads to their **salvation**. They believe that when Jesus died he took away their sins and showed them how to obtain eternal life. This is what is celebrated at **Easter**.

The **Bible** is an important text for many Christians.

Jesus told many **parables** and often Christians today still use them for guidance in life.

Most people with Christian worldviews believe in God as **Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit**. Jesus is the Son of God.

The **incarnation** is a very important belief for most people with Christian worldviews hold that God became a human being in the flesh.

Christianity marks rites of passage such as **baptism, marriage and funerals (death)** with important ceremonies.

### KS2

The Christian festival of the **nativity (Christmas)** is a **fixed date but** the date of Easter (**Pascha**) is based on the lunar (moon) cycle.

**Reconciliation and forgiveness** are important. Reconciliation reunited humans and God after the Fall.

Christians might do hard things like **fast** before Lent, engage in **charity** work or go on a **pilgrimage**.

Jesus is represented globally in different ways, expressing the **incarnation** with diversity.

**Bible** stories can be interpreted **literally, metaphorically, symbolically, spiritually and mythologically** and still have value and meaning.

Christian art and icons can be important for **worship** individually and communally. Concepts like **incarnation, salvation and reconciliation** can be represented in art and architecture.

Christians usually understand **God as Trinity: Father, Son & Holy Spirit**. They might understand God in feminine ways too.

You can be a Christian by going to **church** or not, perhaps even being part of an online Christian community.

**Prayer** is often important in Christian worldviews.

Christian worldviews usually include beliefs about **heaven** and **eternal life**.
