### KS1

The **Five Pillars of Islam** are the most important beliefs and practice of Islam and those with Muslim worldviews usually try to keep them:

- **Shahadah** (declaration of one God-Allah- and his prophet Muhammad (PBUH))
- **Zakat** (giving)
- **Sawm** (fasting)
- **Salat** (prayers)
- **Hajj** (pilgrimage to Mecca)

Those with Muslim worldviews can learn how to live well from the **Qur'an** (the Muslim holy book). Muslims usually believe that the **Angel Gibril revealed** the Qur'an to **Muhammad (PBUH)** and it is **God's word**.

Those with Muslim worldviews often gather at the local **mosque/masjid**.

The **Aqeeqah** is an act of worship many Muslims perform when a baby is born. Meat is usually served and the baby is named.

Those with Muslim worldviews believe in **one God** they refer to as '**Allah**'.

The Qur'an contains **99 Beautiful Names of Allah** that provide insights into what God is like for those with Muslim worldviews. These are often written in beautiful **calligraphy**.

Muslim women and girls might choose to wear a **hijab** but they might not. In the UK they can make their own decisions about clothing.
