Paganism is a term that covers a great number of spiritual and religious beliefs, often centred on honouring the Earth.

People with pagan worldviews might believe in similar things to those with other religious beliefs, such as spirit guides.

People with pagan worldviews might use different symbols and they can be wiccans, druids, heathens or other types of pagans. Each group has different beliefs.

KS2

Nature and the seasons are central to pagan worldviews and are celebrated through rituals and festivals, such as Yule, Beltane and Samhain.

YOU ARE HERE

Those with pagan worldviews often hold the belief of 'living in circle' with all of nature.

Those with pagan worldviews might apply the concept of 'personhood' beyond humans, such as to rivers and forests, and give these similar rights to humans.

Those with pagan worldviews often have sacred sites, usually at places of natural and historical significance, where they may perform ceremonies and rituals and leave amulets and charms for good luck and protection.

The Rollright Stones are a local site important for many people with pagan worldviews and these stand on a Neolithic site of significance.

Those with pagan worldviews often see life as a circle and death as a necessary part of life, just as it is in the rest of nature.

Those with pagan worldviews might describe themselves as religious or non-religious. They might hold a range of beliefs about the spiritual world or the supernatural.
