Why is Road Safety Important?

Staying Safe Every Day

Road safety is about protecting ourselves and others when using roads, whether walking, cycling, or in a car.

Did You Know?

Every year, thousands of accidents happen on roads. By learning road safety rules, we can help prevent these accidents and stay safe.



Key Road Safety Rules

For Pedestrians

- Always use a zebra crossing or traffic lights to cross the road.
- Look both ways before crossing.
- Never run across roads.
- Stay on the pavement, away from the edge.

For Cyclists

- Always wear a helmet.
- Use hand signals to show where you're going.
- Stay in the cycle lane if there is one.
- Make sure your bike has working lights and reflectors.

Be Visible, Be Safe

Why Visibility Matters

Wearing bright or reflective clothing helps drivers see you, especially at night or in bad weather. Always carry a torch or wear reflective bands when walking in the dark.



Common Road Hazards

For Pedestrians

- Cars reversing from driveways.
- Cyclists on pavements.
- Uneven surfaces or potholes.

For Cyclists

- Cars opening doors suddenly.
- Wet or slippery roads.
- Pedestrians stepping into the cycle lane.
