Prior Learning

Concepts

Key Vocabulary

Islam - the religion of the Muslims. A religion recognising one God, Allah, as revealed through the Prophet of Muhammad.

Hadiths - words, actions and instructions of the Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) as reported by the people around him during his life.


Mosque - a Muslim place of worship.

Qu'ran - religious text of Islam, which Muslims believe to come from God (Allah).

The 5 Pillars of Islam - are some basic acts in Islam, needed by believers, they are the foundation of Muslim life.

Sacred: connected with God or a religious purpose and so deserving respect.

The Five Pillars are the core beliefs and practices of Islam:

- Profession of Faith (shahada). The belief that "There is no god but God, and Muhammad is the Messenger of God" is central to Islam. ...
- Prayer (salat). ...
- Alms (zakat). ...
- Fasting (sawm). ...
- Pilgrimage (hajj).
